U23s Exit Cup After Tough Afternoon at Myrak Park

Buckhurst Hill U23s saw their cup run come to an end at the first-round stage after a difficult afternoon at Myrak Park, as an in-form Newham Wanderers side ran out 7-0 winners.

Despite the heavy scoreline, the young Stags showed plenty of positive intent throughout the contest and enjoyed several encouraging spells in possession, moving the ball well and attempting to build patiently from the back. On a number of occasions Buckhurst Hill worked promising positions in the final third, but a lack of cutting edge in front of goal meant their approach play went unrewarded.

Newham, however, proved clinical when opportunities presented themselves. A couple of defensive errors allowed the visitors to take control of the contest, and two goals before the break gave Wanderers a 2-0 advantage at half-time.

Buckhurst Hill continued to compete in the second half and did not shy away from trying to play football, but Newham kept the pressure on and began to make their dominance count on the scoreboard. As the half wore on, the visitors added further goals, eventually extending their lead to 7-0 by the final whistle. One of the standout moments of the match came from a beautifully struck free kick, which summed up Newham's ability to capitalise on Buckhurst Hill's mistakes.

There were still positives to take for the home side, with Max Handley producing a resilient and hardworking display in difficult circumstances. His commitment and composure were recognised with the Man of the Match award, and his performance will be something he will look to build upon as the season continues.

While the result was a disappointing one, there were signs within the performance that suggest the U23s will take valuable lessons from this outing and return stronger in their upcoming fixtures.

MEET OUR OPPONENTS

ILFORD FC

Ilford Football Club began life in 1881 as one of many hundreds of village teams but it rose to considerable heights and national acclaim.

The Club was a founder-member of the Southern League in 1894. However, its owners' refusal to adopt professionalism led to its withdrawal two years later, being replaced by an emergent Tottenham Hotspur (whatever happened to them?).

The professional-amateur debate which dominated football at the time did not prevent Ilford from securing a first (Isthmian) League title in 1907. Numerous Essex County Cups were to follow. Ilford captain Joe Dines even won a Gold medal at the 1912 Stockholm Olympics as part of the all-conquering Great Britain team.


The First World War took its toll with four players being killed, including Joe Dines. However, the side which Ilford put together in the 1920s proved its' most successful to date with back-to-back Isthmian titles (1922/1923) and consecutive FA Amateur Cup Final victories in 1929 and 1930.

The decade also witnessed glamorous European tours, with games against Spanish giants FC Barcelona and victory over Ajax in a packed Olympic Stadium in Amsterdam. A further FA Amateur Cup Final followed in 1936 and home gates of over 10,000 were not uncommon.

After the Second World War, Ilford's iconic Lynn Road stadium was used for numerous representative games. India played their first international match after independence as part of the 1948 London Olympics. Many professional clubs visited and Ilford beat a strong West Ham team in 1962. The end of the minimum wage in the 1960s resulted in a growing elitism in the game and brought about a sharp decline in amateur football.

Despite earning Wembley visits in both 1958 and 1974 as Amateur Cup finalists, Ilford's fortunes fell. In 1977 the Lynn Road ground was sold and a new stadium failed to materialise amid an unforeseen tax bill. There followed a succession of ground-shares and mergers with other clubs.

While playing fortunes have fluctuated, optimism is currently high that there may be further glories ahead. Successive National Lottery awards in the early 2000's, an impressive recent Youth development programme and the recruitment of several key personnel all bode well as the old Club rises to confront new challenges.

With Dino Maras sidelined through illness, former Potters Bar keeper Fred Burbidge stepped in between the sticks. Preston Knight returned to the starting XI at centre-back in place of the injured Jack Johnson, while Josh Banfield came back into the lineup after featuring from the bench last time out.

Woodford started brightly and almost took an early lead when Yemi Adelani fired just over inside the opening three minutes. The Stags soon settled and went close through Harry Lusher, who struck the bar before firing the rebound over from close range. Burbidge then produced an excellent low save to deny the visitors and keep the scores level.

Buckhurst Hill grew into the game, with efforts from Callum Maltese, Arthur Massingham and Lusher as the pressure built. The breakthrough arrived on 40 minutes when a deflected Massingham cross found Lusher at the back post, the forward calmly slotting home his 14th goal of the season. The hosts nearly doubled their lead moments later, while Woodford keeper Chinyere was forced into a sharp save from a George Edwards corner before the break.

The Stags carried their momentum into the second half and were quickly on the front foot again. Lusher was denied a second by a fine save before Massingham doubled the advantage, reacting quickest after Maltese's initial effort was saved and firing home in front of the home support.

Williams rotated his squad as the game wore on, with Tony Martin, Dimitri Nicolaou and Yannis Mengou introduced. Woodford pushed forward late on but Buckhurst Hill remained solid, and deep into stoppage time a costly error from the visitors' keeper allowed Martin to chip home a third, dedicating the goal to his newborn daughter.

It was a statement Derby Day victory to end the year in Roding Blue.

After the match, Mark Williams said:

"It's always good to beat your local rivals. Woodford are a good side and had chances early, but once we played in their half the goals came. January will be busy and it will be a squad game."
